**CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

**APPROVAL CONDITIONS FOR THE PROPOSED LANDFILL AND  
WASTE COMPOSTING PLANT**

The approval of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is granted on condition that Fort Portal Municipality shall:

(i) fulfill the legal requirement for zoning the site as special for waste handling and disposal;

(ii) construct and maintain an access road for transportation of waste to the site and install guard rails at points that are likely to be sources of accidents and rollovers of traffic into the valley;

(iii) provide an adequate buffer zone around the site planted with trees and appropriate vegetation;

(iv) take the necessary step to ensure that hazardous waste such as clinical and chemical waste etc., are not part of the waste to be subjected to the composting process;

(v) restrict access to the site by fencing off the site to ensure that the waste composting and disposal activities at site are not interfered with by activities in the surroundings and vice-versa;

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- (vi) restrict access to the site by fence off the site to ensure that the waste composting and disposal activities at the site are not interfered with by activities in the surroundings and vice-versa.
- (vii) ensure that any effluent discharges from the waste site conform to the National Environment (Standards for Discharge of the Effluent into Water or on Land) Regulations, 1999.
- (viii) obtain the requisite licences for operation/owning a waste disposal site and transportation of waste to the site under the National Environment (Waste Management) Regulations 1999.
- (ix) ensure that the waste site is used solely for composting and disposal of waste categorised as municipal waste unless a licence is obtained for handling and disposal of such other waste.
- (x) undertake and maintain records of regular water quality analysis of the Kigezi stream east of the site.
- (xi) put in place proper and adequate drainage around the site to trap storm water and prevent it from invading the composting process operational area.
- (xii) encourage the separate collection of plastic mineral water bottles, other recyclable plastics and materials in the town Council for recycling purposes.
- (xiii) create community awareness about the waste composting project activities so that there is appreciation of the project and support of the project objectives, activities and outputs.
- (xiv) control rodents, pests and disease vectors at the waste site and the surroundings.
- (xv) ensure that persons working under the direction of Fort Portal Town Council comply with the national environment laws and that they manage waste in a manner that does not cause ill health to persons or damage the environment.
- (xvi) undertake annual self-audits and transmit them to NEMA.
- (xvii) implement the Environmental Monitoring Plan contained in the EIS and ensuring record keeping as contained in Section 77 of the National

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(xviii) in accordance with Section 22 (4) of the National Environment Act Cap 153, Fort Portal Municipal Council will be required to ensure that any other undesirable environmental impacts that may arise due to implementing this project but were not contemplated by the time of undertaking this environmental impact assessment are mitigated.
